- (b) The Indian Council of Social Science Research has two schemes for financial assistance to research journals conducted by professional organisations of social scientists functioning at the national level. In the first scheme the professional organisations collect Rs. 25,000, the Indian Council of Social Science Research gives Rs. 25,000 and the Ford Foundation gives a grant-in-aid of Rs. 50,000. The total amount of Rs. 1 lakh thus collected is converted into an Endowment Fund and the interest from this goes to the support of journal. In the second scheme, the Council gives a grantin-aid not exceeding Rs, 5,000 per year for a period of not exceeding five years. The Council also operates another scheme under which it buys a number of subscriptions of periodical concerned with documentation and distributes them to selected institutions.
