OVERSEAS TRADE

140. SHRI SANAT KUMAR RAHA: Wil] the Minister of SHIPPING AND TRANSPORT be pleased to .state:

- (a) whether it is a fact that the over all share of Indian Shipping in the country's overseas trade is only 20 per cent;
- (b) whether the country is entitled to carry 50 per cent of its overseas trade in Indian bottoms;
- (c) whether any steps are being taken to increase the share of Indian shipping in the contry's overseas trade during the fifth Plan.
- (d) if so, what are the details of the steps being taken in this respect; and
- (e) how much of the country's overseas trade is expected to be carried in Indian bottoms by the end of the fifth Plan?

THE MINISTER OF SHIPPING AND TRANSPORT (SHRI RAJ BAHADUR):

- (a) and (b) Yes, Sir.
- (c) to (e) The Fifth Plan target for shipping has not yet been fixed. ! As more than twothirds of our oversea? trade consists of movement of bulk commodties Government have, since the begining of the Third Plan laid emphasis on acquisition of bulk carriers and tankers. As at present | there are 8 tankers of 4.28 lakhs dwt, 23 bulk carriers of 9.68 lakhfi dwt and 10 OBOs of 467 lakhs dwt in operation in the overseas trade. In addition 17 tankers of 8.81 lakhs dwt, 8 bulk carriers of 5.89 lakhs dwt and 3 OBOs of 3.18 lakhs dwt ar_a under construction. It is the aim of Government -that Indian shipping should carry a minium of 50 per cent of the overseas trade by the end of the Fifth Plan, as also to participate in l.he cross trading to the extent possible.

PRODUCTION OF GRAIN IN RABI SEASON

- 141. SHRI N. G. GOARY: Will the Minister of AGRICULTURE be pleased to state:
- (a) the probable production of grain in the Rabi Season 1972-73; and
- (b) the states where the crash programme for producing more Rabi crops was carried out; and the results thereof?

THE MINISTER OF STATE IN THE MINISTRY OF AGRICULTURE (SHRI (a) and (b). The ANNASHIB SHINDE): Emergency Production Agricultural Programme for increasing production of foodgrains during Rabi-Summer, 1972-73, is being implemented in almost all the States. The main emphasis under the programme is on quick-maturing minor irrigation schemes, such energisation of tubewell|pump as 1ift irrigation projects, etc. As a result of this programme and the beneficial winter rains, area and production of rabi crops are expected to show an increase over 1971-72 n some 01 tue States like Uttar Pradesh, Bihar, Punjab and Haryana. In the States of Maharashtra, Gujarat and Rajasthan where rains have continued to be deficient in the rabi season, rabi crops out put may register some fall. Apart from the continuance of adverse weather conditions in some States, the overall shortage of power and fertilizers also might affect the production the rabi season to some extent. While increase over last year's rabi production expected, in the country as a whole, firm estimates of production of rabi foodgrains would become available at the close of the agricultural year, i.e. sometime in July-August, 1973.

NATIONAL HIGHWAYS

- 142. SARDAR GURCHARAN SINGH TOHRA: Will the Minister of SHIPPING AND TRANSPORT be pleased to state:
- (a) the lengths of the National Highways that pass through the ter-

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ritories of Haryana and Punjab respectively;

- (b) the amount given to -Governments for the repairs etc. of the Highways during the last 3 years, year wise; and
- (c) the details of the work done during the period?

THE MINISTER OF STATE IN THE SHIPPING MINISTRY OF TRANSPORT (SHRI M. B. RANA): (a) Lengths of National Highways at present passing (through the States of Harayana and Punjab are 600 Kms. and 961 Kms. respectively. In Punjab, lengths totalling to 436 Kms. were added to the National Highway System in two instalments only in July 1971 and March 1972.

(b) The amount allotted to the Governments of Haryana and Punjab for the repairs etc. of National Highways during the last 3 years is as under:—

- (c) The maintenance works mainly consisted of the following categories in the two States:
 - (i) Normal maintenance and repairs;
 - (ii) Periodic renewals; and
 - (iii) Special repairs.

However, while in the Punjab, the Special Repair was of a small order, that in Haryana was sizeable. addition, there were also substantial flood damage repairs in Haryana.

SETBACK IN THE RABI CROP PRODUCTION

THE MINISTER OF STATE IN THE MINISTRY OF AGRICULTURE (SHRI ANNASHIB SHINDE): (a) to (c). As a result of the Rabi crop production drive aided by the beneficial winter rains, area and production of rabi crops are expected to show an increase over 1971-72 in some of the States like Uttar Pradesh Bihar, Punjab and Harvana. On the other hand, in the States of Maharashtra, Gujarat and Rajasthan where rains have continued to be deficient in the rabi season, rabi crop output may register some fall. Apart from adverse weather conditions in some States, the overall shortage of power and fertilisers might affect the production during the rabi season to some extent. While increase over last year's rabi production is expected in the country as a whole, firm estimates of production would become avilable after the close of the agricultural year, i.e. some time in July-August,
