- (a) whether it is a fact that West Bengal Government have approached the Central Government for an increased wheat quota;
 - (b) if so, the details thereof; and
- (c) the decision taken by the Central Government?

THE MINISTER OF STATE IN THE MINISTRY OF AGRICULTURE (SHRI ANNASAHEB SHINDE): (a) and (b) A request was received from West Bengal Government for increasing the allocation of wheat from 80,000 tonnes to 1,10,000 tonnes per month.

(c) Taking into account the overall availability of wheat stocks in the Central pool and the requirements of other deficit and drought affected States, the reasonable requirements of wheat of the West Bengal Government

are being met from the Central pool. The State Government have been allotted 85,000 tonnes of wheat for the month of March, 1973.
