वमणं के पश्चात और सभी क्षेत्रों की ग्राणाग्रों की पूर्ति करने की दृष्टि से संसद ने मुल्की नियम अधिनियम पारित किया । यद्यपि इस कानन का तात्कालिक परिणाम ग्रान्ध प्रदेश के लोगों की भावनात्रों को शान्त करना या परन्त राज्य के विभिन्न भागों में, खास तौर पर मान्ध्र क्षेत्र में शीध्र ही हिसात्मक घटनाम्रों की पूनरावृत्ति हुई। एक वहुत बड़ी संख्या में हिसात्मक घटनायें हुई जिससे जान-माल की हानि हुई । विधि और व्यवस्था की शक्तियों द्वारा ऐसी गतिविधियों को रोकना आवश्यक था इसलिए शक्ति का प्रयोग करना पड़ा जिसके कारण भी कुछ जानें गई ग्रौर कुछ व्यक्ति घायल हए । इयुटी पर तैनात कर्मचारी बहुत बड़ी संख्या में घायल हुए । जबकि सरकार को व्यक्तियों के मरने ग्रौर वायल होने पर श्रति खेद है, यह महसूस किया जाता है कि ग्रव्यवस्था ग्रीर तनाव के वातावरण में किसी विषय पर गम्भीर रूप से विचार विनिमय नहीं हो सकता । इस पेचीदा समस्या को प्रजातांत्रिक हंग से हल करने के प्रयत्न करने से पहले जाति ग्रीर व्यवस्था तथा सामान्य स्थिति का पूर्ण रूप से होना जरूरी है। स्थानीय नेताओं की सहायता से ऐसा प्रयत्न किया जा रहा है।

t[THE MINISTER OF STATE IN THE MINISTRY OF HOME AFFAIRS (SHRI K. C. PANT): (a) to (c). Following the Supreme Court ruling pronounced on October 3, 1972 proclaiming the validity of the Mulki Rules, some agitations were started in the Andhra region of Andhra Pradesh. In some parts of that State there were violent incidents resulting in loss of life and damage to public property. Unfortunately, the leaders of the State could not come to any agreement during discussion between themselves. The Chief Minister of Andhra Pradesh and his colleagues wanted the Central Government to take decisions on all matters relating to Mulki Rules. Following discussions by the Central leaders with

the Andhra Pradesh leaders and representatives of different sections of the people and with a view to provid-ing satisfaction to the expectations of all the regions, the Parliament passed the Mulki Rules Act. Although the immediate effect of this legislation was to assuage the feelings of the people in Andhra Pradesh, there was soon recurrence of violent activities in different parts of the State, more parti-cu'arly in the Andhra region. A large number of violent incidents have taken place leading to loss of property and human life. The forces of law and order had to curb such activities and force had to be used which also led to some deaths and injuries. Injuries were also sustained by a large number of persons on duty. While Government deeply regret the deaths and injuries, it is felt that no serious discussion on any matter can take place in an atmosphere of disorder and tension. Peace and order have fully to be ensured and normalcy has to be restored before efforts can be made to find a democratic 'solution to the complicated problem. This effort is being made with the help of local leaders.]
