REMOVAL OF BEGGARY

1829. SHRIMATI PRATIBHA SINGH: Will the MINISTER OF EDUCATION, SOCIAL WELFARE AND CULTURE be pleased to state:

- (a) whether any survey on the number of beggars in the country has been made; if so, the number of child ren and old men in the category of beggars; and
- (b) whether any steps have recent ly been initiated by Government so that beggary can be removed from the country by providing decent means of livelihood to the beggars?

THE DEPUTY MINISTER IN THE MINISTRY OF EDUCATION, SOCIAL WELFARE AND CULTURE (SHRI ARVIND NETAM): (a) No, Sir, there has been no national survey, However, the Census Reports contain information regarding beggars and vagrants. According to the 1971 Census (1% advance tabulation) there are 7,44,500 such persons. This number is subject to variations On account of seasonal factors as also of the general growth in population.

(b) The problem of beggary is being tackled in the short term through antibeggary laws in various States which provide for setting up of institutional services for training of the ablebodied beggars for their ultimate rehabilitation. The various socio-economic programmes are expected to have long term impact on eradicating beggary.
