THE MINISTER OF STATE IN THE MINISTRY OF URBAN DEVELOPMENT (SHRI SAUGATA RAY): (a) Delhi Development Authority (DDA) has informed that there is short supply of potable water during summer season.

(b) DDA has also informed that there was uneven distribution of water due to which some residents were getting less quantity of water.

(c) to (e) DDA has further reported that the residents had approached DDA in this regard and the problem has been sorted out by laying extra lines.

Projects in Orissa

- (a) the details of projects received from the State Government of Orissa under the Urban Infrastructure Development Scheme for Small and Medium Towns (UIDSSMT);
- (b) the details of the project proposals accepted by the Ministry;
- (c) whether it is a fact that funds relating to some of the projects are pending for release;
- (d) if so, the details thereof; and
- (e) by when the funds are going to be released for the above projects?

THE MINISTER OF STATE IN THE MINISTRY OF URBAN DEVELOPMENT (SHRI SAUGATA RAY): (a) The State of Orissa submitted 28 projects for funding under Urban infrastructure Development Scheme for Small and Medium Towns Scheme (UIDSSMT).

(b) 16 projects at an approved cost of Rs. 222.78 crore have been considered for release of funds involving total Central Assistance of Rs. 179.91 crore and funds amounting to Rs. 90.80 crore has already been released to the State. A Statement showing the details of projects, approved cost and funds release is enclosed as Statement-I (See below).

(c) No, Sir. The remaining 12 projects could not be considered for release as the central commitment involved in any of these projects can not be accommodated within the balance allocation of Rs. 1.88 crore.

(d) Details of the above 12 projects is enclosed as Statement-II (See below).

(e) Funds for the above projects cannot be released as the central commitment involved in each of these projects is far in excess of the balance allocation of Rs. 1.88 crore of the State of Orissa.
