Cases of brain stroke in the country

†1479. SHRI UPENDRA KUSHWAHA : Will the Minister of HEALTH AND FAMILY WELFARE be pleased to state:

(a) whether it is a fact that two hundred to two hundred and fifty people out of every lakh persons dying of non-contagious diseases are victims of brain stroke in the country;

(b) whether it is also a fact that one fifth of the people, who died of brain stroke, are youths in the age-group 30 to 40 years; and

(c) if so, the plan made by Government to prevent deaths due to brain stroke?

THE MINISTER OF HEALTH AND FAMILY WELFARE (SHRI GHULAM NABI AZAD) : (a) and (b) According to Indian Council of Medical Research (ICMR), the mortality data from stroke cases is not routinely collected in the country. The hospital based data from India indicates a high proportion (one-fourth) of young stroke (first ever stroke onset <40 years of age), ranging between 15% and 30%.

(c) The Government of India has approved a National Programme for Prevention and Control of Cancer, Diabetes, Cardiovascular Disease and Stroke at an estimated outlay of Rs. 1230.90 crore for the 11th Five Year Plan. The programme focuses on health promotion, capacity building including human resource development, early diagnosis and management of these diseases and integration with the primary health care system.

Treatment of thyroid disorder

†1480. SHRI PRABHAT JHA : Will the Minister of HEALTH AND FAMILY WELFARE be pleased to state:

(a) whether it is a fact that thyroid disorder has taken a form of silent killer in the country;

(b) if so, the details thereof;

(c) whether Government is aware of the fact that 90 per cent people suffering from thyroid disorder could not get the treatment in the country; and

(d) if so, the details thereof?

THE MINISTER OF HEALTH AND FAMILY WELFARE (SHRI GHULAM NABI AZAD) : (a) and (b) According to the National Family Health Survey (NFHS-3) 2005-06, number of men and women suffering from Goitre or other thyroid disorders in 2005-06 (age group of 15-49) was 383 and 949 per 100,000 respectively. The incidence and prevalence of hypothyroidism is increasing in the country. The exact data regarding deaths due to thyroid disorders is not known but it is considered that mortality due to hypothyroidism is low.
