Funds for 35th National Games in Kerala

1849. DR. T.N. SEEMA: Will the Minister of YOUTH AFFAIRS AND SPORTS be pleased to state:

(a) whether Government has released any funds for the organization of the 35th National Games to be held in Kerala;

(b) the total cost estimate for the Games and the total amount released to Kerala each year so far; and

(c) whether Kerala has requested for additional funds for this financial year and whether Government would release the amount soon?

THE MINISTER OF STATE IN THE MINISTRY OF YOUTH AFFAIRS AND SPORTS (SHRI PRATIK PRAKASHBAPU PATIL): (a) and (b) The Central Government has sanctioned

an Additional Central Assistance (ACA) of Rs. 110 crore (50% of the project cost of Rs. 220 crore) to the State Government of Kerala for staging the 35th National Games to be held in Kerala. Rs. 55 crores have already been released to the State Government towards the first installment. In addition, an amount of Rs. 20 crore has been earmarked in the Sports Department's Budget for 2010-11 for upgradation and renovation of Sports Authority of India Centres in Kerala that have been identified as competition venues for the 35th National Games.

- (c) No such request has been received from Government of Kerala in the Ministry.

Performance of Indians in CWG

1850. SHRI PRAVEEN RASHTRAPAL: Will the Minister of YOUTH AFFAIRS AND SPORTS be pleased to state:

- (a) whether the Ministry has carried out any analysis of performance by Indian sportsmen/women in the recent Commonwealth Games;
- (b) if so, the details thereof; and
- (c) whether the Ministry has prepared advance plan to improve performance of our sportsmen during next Olympics/Asian games?

THE MINISTER OF STATE IN THE MINISTRY OF YOUTH AFFAIRS AND SPORTS (SHRI PRATIK PRAKASHBAPU PATIL): (a) and (b) Yes, Sir. India has won 101 medals (38 Gold, 27 Silver and 36 Bronze) in the XIX Commonwealth Games. This was highest ever in any major international sporting event. The number of medals won were more than double the medals, India has won in the last Commonwealth Games in Melbourne, 2006 (22 Gold, 17 Silver and 11 Bronze), India stood Second in the Medal Tally after Australia and ahead of other major sporting nations such as England, Canada and South Africa. Indian athletes have registered outstanding medal winning performance even in those sports such as Gymnastics, Athletics, and Swimming etc. which have, traditionally, been poor performing sports. Women athletes have recorded excellent performance.

- (c) Yes, Sir.
