Role of MSME in poverty alleviation and economic growth

1964. SHRI THOMAS SANGMA: Will the Minister of MICRO, SMALL AND MEDIUM ENTERPRISES be pleased to state:

(a) whether village-based micro and small enterprises play a major role in poverty alleviation and economic growth;

(b) whether a large number of such enterprises, particularly in the North-Eastern Region, have failed or become constrained due to inadequate or unreliable supply of electricity;

(c) if so, the number of such enterprises in the country, State-wise; and

(d) the details of plan of Government, the allocation made, and the progress achieved to secure electricity supply to those enterprises from decentralized renewable energy based solutions during the Eleventh Five year Plan period so far, State-wise?

THE MINISTER OF STATE OF THE MINISTRY OF MICRO, SMALL AND MEDIUM ENTERPRISES (SHRI DINSHA J. PATEL): (a) As per 4th All India Census of Micro, Small and Medium Enterprises 2006-07 conducted in 2009, the share of micro

and small enterprises, including the village based ones, in the manufacturing sector of the country is 45.24% for the year 2007-08 (latest available).

(b) and (c) No large scale failure of micro and small enterprises, including those in the North-Eastern Region (NER), has been brought to the notice of this Ministry. It is, however, a common knowledge that there is shortage of electricity supply in the NER besides several other constraints like physical accessibility and other basic infrastructure conducive to the development of growth of such enterprises, including uninterrupted power supply. State-wise details of such enterprises are not centrally maintained in the Ministry.

(d) Ministry of New and Renewable Energy have informed that no State-wise allocation of funds is made by that Ministry. Central financial assistance is, however, provided for installation of stand-alone Solar Photovoltaics (SPV) systems as per provision of the SPV programme, on case to case basis, based on proposals received from State implementing agencies.

Growth potential in KVIC

1965. SHRI M.V. MYSURA REDDY: Will the Minister of MICRO, SMALL AND MEDIUM ENTERPRISES be pleased to state:

(a) to what extent enhancing the budget from Rs. 251 crores in 2009-10 to Rs. 542 crores in 2010-11 has helped the Ministry in vigorously marketing its Khadi and other products;

(b) the details of growth of KVIC during last ten years, year-wise and sector-wise;

(c) whether any action plan prepared to achieve the growth potential in KVIC; and

(d) if so, the details thereof?

THE MINISTER OF STATE OF THE MINISTRY OF MICRO, SMALL AND MEDIUM ENTERPRISES (SHRI DINSHA J. PATEL): (a) Enhancement in the budget provision for khadi in 2010-11 was mainly on account of introduction of Market Development Assistance (MDA) Scheme on production of khadi and polyvastra and implementation of Khadi Reform Development Programme (KRDP) assisted by Asian Development Bank. MDA has been introduced with effect from 1 April, 2010 with the approval of the Cabinet Committee on Economic Affairs with a more focused, flexible, growth stimulating and artisan-centric scheme of Market Development Assistance (MDA) for providing assistance to khadi institutions @ 20% of the value of production of khadi and polyvastra, for implementation by the Khadi and Village Industries Commission (KVIC) during 2010-11 and 2011-12. This initiative was necessitated for ensuring that spinners and weavers also get a part of the assistance while providing flexibility to the institutions to offer discount to customers. While 25% of the MDA
