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SALE OF BANGLA DESH RELIEF ARTICLES IN THEMARKET

- (a) whether any investigations have been made into the allegations of sale of Bangla Desh Relief articles in the market in the country; and
 - (b) if so, what are the details thereof?

THE DEPUTY MINISTER IN THE MINISTRY OF LABOUR AND REHABILITATION (SHRI BALGOVIND VERMA): (a) and (b) There have been certain press reports alleging some relief goods for Bangladesh refugees received by the Indian Red Cross Society and Oxfam having found their way into the market. The Chairman of the Indian Red Cross Society has denied the allegations. Inquiries are, however, being made regarding alleged leakage of Oxfam relief supplies and certain further complaints. Findings are still awaited.

SHRI KRISHAN KANT: Is it not a fact that whatever little smuggling or leakage may have been, it is only because of some professional smuggling that goes on? As a matter of fact, all the material received was really utilized for the refugees. Is it not a fact? To say that a lot of leakage has gone on is something wrong. Is it not a fact?

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SHRI BALGOVID VERMA: The relief supplies from foreign countries are received by three agencies: (i) the Government of India, (ii) Indian Red Cross Society, and (iii) some autonomous agencies. So far as the Government of India is concerned, there is nothing wrong; we have every account of all the articles received from foreign countries. So far as the Indian Red Cross is concerned, the President of the Indian Red Cross Society has explained 10 the Press that nothing wrong has gone with them. Some complaints have been received regarding Oxfam material, particularly rugs, that they were exchanged during the course of transit by indigenous rugs. Inquiries are going on.

SHRI KRISHAN KANT: Is it not a fact, Sir, that Sir Robert Jackson, UN High Commissioner for Reiugees, came here for investigation and, if so, what was the result or the report he has given?

SHRI R. K. KHADILKAR: We have no knowledge about this gentleman visiting India for this purpose.

SHRI BRAHMANANDA PANDA: In 1964 also, during the Chinese aggression there were reports thai instead of dropping the supplies on the front, things were dropped in the Calcutta marker. Here also it is the same thing. There are so many rumours in the Press that such things are now being sold in the Calcutta market. I want to know whether the Government would seriously take up the matter and see that the culprits are brought to book?

SHRI R. K. KHADILKAR: Sir, sometimes all chese matters find expression in :m exaggerated manner. That is our experience. So far as the handling of refugee relief mater lal is concerned, the Indian Red Cross has done an excellent job. Even international organijia-tions have appreciated their work. There might be some cases—not of that magnitude to which my hon, friend referred. The matter has been

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taken up by the Red Cross Society and they are looking into all aspects of it.

SHRI J. S. TILAK: Whatever little refugee relief has found its way in the Calcutta market or Delhi market, why should the Government not seize the goods, as they do in the case of smuggled goods and then enquire about them? These anti-social elements should be dealt with severely.

SHRI R. K. KHADILKAR: I may mention one factor in this respect. First of all, when these little whisperings and complaints came to us, we tried to find out and locate whether such a material at all came in a consignment for refugee purposes and we discovered that ihere was no such material that was handed over for refugee relief. Something else was there. How could we seize that?

श्री गुरुमुख सिंह मुसाफिर: अखबारों में बहुत सी खबरें इस किस्म की छपी हैं और क्यों- कि ऐसे मौके पर बाज दफा बहत सी बातें प्रोपागेंडा के तौर पर भी छापी जाती हैं, इसलिए मैं जानना चाहता हूं कि सरकार ने कोई ऐसी छानबीन की है कि उन खबरों में कितनी कुछ सच्चाई है, कितनी कुछ हकीकत है और अगर छानबीन की है तो क्या उसको कोई पबलिश भी किया है लोगों की जानकारी के लिये।

श्री बाल गोविन्द वर्मा: शिकायतें हमारे पास अ।ई थीं कि कुछ मैटीरियल जो कि बंगला देश के रिफयूजीज के लिए आया था वह बाजार में बिक रहा है और उसके बारे में हमने जानकारी की । जैसा कि मैंने बताया, गवर्नमेंट आफ इंडिया को जो कुछ मिला है वह सब ठीक है उसमें कहीं कोई कमी नजर नहीं आई है और उसके बारे में कोई शिकायत नहीं मिली है। इंडियन रेड क्रास सोसाइटी से हमने पूछा तो उनके प्रेसिडेंट ने एक स्टेटमेंट दिया है प्रेस को और उसमें उन्होंने सब बता दिया है कि कितने रुपये का सामान मिला. कितना डिस्ट्रीब्यूट किया, कितना अब भी है और कितना ऐसा है जो कि बंगला देश को भेजा है। हाँ, ओक्सफाम के बारे में यह जरूर है कि कुछ कम्बल ले जाते समय टक वालों ने बीच में यहां के कम्बलों से बदल दिया है। उसकी जानकारी हम कर रहे हैं। जहां कहीं से भी हमको कोई जानकारी मिलती है उसको हम देखते हैं। हां, एक और बात है। कैनेडियन हाई किमश्नर जो इंडिया में हैं उन्होंने बताया कि वह कुल्लू गये थे और जो स्वेटर वहां विक रहे हैं वह कैनाडा के हैं और वह वहां विक रहे हैं। हमने जानकारी की तो पता लगा कि वह कैनाडा के नहीं हैं। हमने अपने यहां जानकारी की तो मालूम हुआ कि कैनाडा से कोई स्वेटर नहीं मिला है।

श्री गनेशो लाल चौघरी: यह हाउस को बताइये तो अच्छा है।

श्री बाल गोविन्द वर्मा: हमारे जो रिहैबि-लिटेशन के सेक्नेटरी हैं उन्होंने पर्सनली कैनाडा के हाई कमिश्नर को बताया कि आपकी जो शिकायत है वह ठीक नहीं है, हमारे यहां तो किसी प्रकार की ऐसी चीज नहीं है।

SHRI ABU ABRAHAM: Sir, I must say lhat the Government answer is most unsatisfactory. Very detailed allegations have been made in the Press and I have got a whole bunch of newspaper cuttings on the subject, about thousands of cartons of baby food and thousands of blankets being lost and their being sold openly in the market. Naturally, the Red Cross Society has denied. But that is no reason why the Government should not make a detailed investigation. Will the Minister confirm as to what happened to the stock which remained in Calcutta at the time of the end of hostilities and about which there was some dispute as lo whether it will be sent to Bangla Desh or used in India and whether it has been sent to Bangla Desh or whether it has been used in India?

SHRI BALGOVIND VERMA: The hon. Member has drawn our attention to the newspaper cuttings. I may tell him that, as already stated here, whenever any complaints come to our notice, we look into them and try lo satisfy ourselves. So far as baby food is concerned, it has been reported by the Indian Red Cross Society that there have been thefts to the extent of about 7 tonnes of their milk and also there was some loss in transit, rail as well as road. The total loss of milk powder is of the order of 245 tonnes out of 10,000 tonnes received by the Society. So, a complaint was lodged

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and the Government have seized some material from some places.

SHRI ABU ABRAHAM: What about the stocks remaining in Calcutta?

SHRI BALGOVIND VERMA: Most of the stocks which were over and above our requirements have been transferred to Bangla Desh. For example, the Indian Red Cross Society received assistance to the tune of Rs. 30 crores. Out of these Rs. 30 crores, Rs. 11 crores worth of goods had been utilised for the Bangla Desh refugees in India and relief supplies of the value of about Rs. 14 crores have been transported to Bangla Desh. Similarly, the Government of India has also transported much of the material to Bangla Desh and, over and above all that which we received from the foreign countries the Government of India itself is giving much help to the Bangla Desh Government.

श्री मार्नासह वर्मा: माननीय मंत्री जी ने अभी अपने उत्तर में बताया था कि विदेशों से शरणार्थियों के लिए जो राहत का सामान आता है उसको प्राप्त करने के लिए 3 एजेन्सीज हैं-गवर्नमेन्ट आफ इंडिया, इंडियन रेड कास सोसाइटी और अलग से राहत कार्य करने वाली एटानामस वाडीज-तो मैं यह जानना चाहता हं कि क्या सेन्ट्ल गवर्नमेन्ट की तरफ से कोई सेन्ट्ल एजेन्सी भी ऐसी आपकी है, क्योंकि कोई भी गड़बड़ होती तो गवर्नमेन्ट आफ इंडिया बदनाम होगी, और कोई भी इस प्रकार की बातें जो हो रही हैं आपके ऊपर उनका दायित्व है। आपकी तरफ से भी सेन्ट्रल एजेन्सी इस प्रकार वर्क करती है कि जितना भी सामान, चाहे किसी भी एजेन्सी द्वारा आया हो, उसका हिसाब-किताब आपके पास ही है और जो डिस्ट्रिब्यूशन हुआ है उसका ब्यौरा भी आपके पास है, तो फिर आप क्या इस प्रकार का ब्यौरा अब तक प्राप्त नहीं कर सके ?

श्री बाल गोविन्द वर्मा : जहां तक वाहर से जो सामान सहायतार्थ आया है वह इंडियन रेड क्रास और आटोनॉमस एजेन्सी के द्वारा भी मिला है। जहां तक इंडियन रेड क्रास सोसाइटी है, उनसे हमने पूछ लिया है। जहां तक और भी एजेन्सीज हैं-"केयर" है, "ओक्सफाम" है

''कैसा'' है, ''वार आन वान्ट'' है और कैथालिक रिलीफ सर्विसेज हैं-हमारा उनसे पूछने का कोई तुक नहीं क्योंकि ये डाइरेक्ट लेते रहे और बांटते रहे। उनसे हमारा संबंध नहीं है।

श्री मानसिंह वर्मा: क्या ये डाइरेक्ट भी मंगा लेते हैं ?

श्री बाल गोविन्द वर्मा: डाइरेक्ट लाते थे और बांटते थे।

श्री मानसिंह वर्मा : इसका मतलब यह है कि आपका कोई नियंत्रण नहीं है।

ALLOY STEEL PLANT, DURGAPUR

- (a) whether Governments' decision to change the product-mix of the Allov Steel Plant at Durgapur has led to unrest among the executives of the plant;
- (b) whether they have submitted any memorandum to Government on this issue;
- (c) if so, what are the points mentioned in the memorandum; and
 - (d) what are Government's views thereon?

THE MINISTER OF STEEL AND MINES (SHRI S. MOHAN KUMARAMANGALAM): (a) to (d) A statement is laid on the Table of the House

STATEMENT

- (a) and (b) The question presumably refers to the decision regarding the product-mix for the expansion of capacity of the Alloy Steels Plant, Durgapur, which does not provide for an increase in production of stainless ste:i. There have been a number of representations from the Alloy Steel Executives' Association against this
- (c) The main points made in the representations arc as under:
 - (i) The present product-mix of the plant is not economically viable. The finishing facililities are inadequate.
