(a) whether estimates have been made as to how much surplus land would be available for distribution after the new land reform laws are passed, statewide; and

(b) if so, the details thereof ?

THE MINISTER OF STATE IN THE MINISTRY OF AGRICULTURE (SHRI ANNASAHAB SHINDE) : (a) and (b) No estimates of the surplus area likely to be available could be made as yet. The State Governments and the Union Territories have been requested to give us such estimates.

SLUM CLEARANCE IN MAHARASHTRA

Will the MINISTER OF WORKS AND HOUSING AND HEALTH AND FAMILY PLANNING be pleased to state :

(a) whether Government of India have received any proposal from the Government of Maharashtra for slum clearance in Bombay and other big cities in Maharashtra; and if so, what financial assistance was given to the State Government for the purpose and how much was utilised; and

(b) what is the progress of the two slum clearance projects undertaken by the State Government which were inaugurated by the Prime Minister ?

THE MINISTER OF WORKS AND HOUSING (SHRI UMA SHANKAR DIKSHIT) : (a) Government of India

have not received any such proposal for Slum Clearance. However proposals for environmental improvements in Bombay, Poona and Nagpur have been received and financial assistance of Rs. 290.12 lakhs sanctioned. Information on utilization has not been received from the State Government as yet,

(b) I lay a statement on the Table of the House, which shows the progress of implementation of the two projects in Maharashtra which were inaugurated by the Prime Minister.

STATEMENTS

I. Western Express highway slum clearance scheme

An area of about 254 acres is involved in the scheme, out of which about 76 acres belong to the various Ministries of the Government of India and about 84 acres belong to the private parties. The question of transfer of Central Government land to the Government of Maharashtra has not been settled yet. Action for acquisition of private land has been initiated.

2. In consultation with HUDCO, the Maharashtra Housing Board decided to implement the scheme in phases. Accordingly, the Board forwarded to HUDCO Part I Phase I of the Scheme for approval and assistance on 14th August, 1971. HUDCO communicated its approval on 12th October, 1971 and agreed to give a loan of Rs. 3.15 crores for this scheme in instalments on the basis of the progress of work. The first instalment of Rs. 28 lakhs was drawn by the Maharashtra Housing Board on 4th November, 1971.

3. Part I Phase I of the scheme, covering three different pieces of land, contemplated :—

(a) Development of 27.55 acres of land;

(b) Disposal of 5 acres of land for commercial purposes; and

(c) Construction of 880 units for sale to middle income groups and 50

tenements for renting out to slum dwellers.

Owing to difficulties in getting possession of some of the land, the Maharashtra Housing Board are proposing to proceed with the scheme with reference to the lands actually available. Accordingly the scheme may now be revised as follows :

(a) Development of 19.55 acres of land;

(b) Disposal of 5.5 acres of land for commercial purposes; and

(c) Construction of 396 MIG tenements and 115 S.C.S. tenements.

Meanwhile the Housing Board has completed the work of filling of an area of about 13 acres and the expenditure incurred on the work upto the end of September, 1972 was Rs. 9.56 lakhs, out of Rs. 28 lakhs advanced by HUDCO. Further funds will be released depending on the utilization of the first instalment.
