The Gandharva Mahavidyalaya, New Delhi accepted an invitation from the Lincoln Centre of Performing Arts, New York and participated in the Third Internaiional Choral Music Festival held in New York in April-May, 1972, by sending their choir group. On application, the Mahavidyalaya was given a partial Travel Subsidy for 28 members of their 29member group.

- (c) The tour, il has been reported, was a success and the choir's performances were very well received.
