Mantri thai ilu industries in West Bengal would be given priority in Defence purchases, provided the products satisfy tlie quality standards sel by the Government. This concession will, however, not lie extended to the monopoly houses.

- (a) On the 4th May 1972, there was a lire in the Durgapur Steel Plant causing damage to Cables and Cable drums.
- (b) The total value of Ihe Cables invoked in the lire is about Rs. 9 lakhs. 'Ehe salvage value of the damaged Cables is estimated to be more than Rs. 5 Lakhs. There was damage to the Stores building amounting to about Rs. 1.000.
- (<) An enquiry Committee was appointed by the General Manager of the Steel Plan! Io investigate into the cause of Ihe fire

and recommend remedial measures for lin me guidance. According to the findings of the Committee the fire could have been caused either by the careless throwing of a burning match slick or a cigarette and causing the dry grass in the area to catch file or by the burning of straw in the vicinity without awareness of the conse-quences, Ehe plant are taking action on the various recommendations of the Com-mittee to prevent such incidents in future.

- (a) Quantities ol' Steel allocated to diffe-ia ni State Directors of Industries and State Small Scale Industries Corporations during October, 1970 to September, 1971 are 84,373 tonnes and 1.00,182 tonnes respectively.
- (bi Percentages of allocation io State Directors of Industries and Slate Small Scale Industries Corporations on total allo-cations are 5.20% and 6.25% respectively. As against this 11.45%, the S.P.C. allocation to D.G.T.D. units came to 6.82%.
- (c) So far as allotment is concerned, it is not correct that there has been any discrimination. As regards prices, supplies of steel to the small scale sector are now made

through the various State Small Scale Industries Corporations, who charge some service charges and include the same in the prices of steel materials released b\ these Corporal ions. This resulted in the price for such units being a little higher than for those getting steel direct from the Steel Plants. Presumably, the Hon' hie Member is referring to this. The question of supplying steel materials to the small scale sector at the same rates, as applicable to the despatches made from the Steel Plants direr i. is receiving the attention of Government.
