despatch and receiving ends to prevent deterioration in the quality and of foodgrains in transit?

THE MINISTER OF STATE IN THE MINISTRY OF AGRICULTURE (SHRI ANNASAHEB SHINDE): Foodgrains procured by the Food Corporation of India are purchased acording to quality specifications laid by the Government of India. At the despatching end, the stocks are properly protected by tarpaulin/. polyetlylene covers, etc. As far as possible, movement of these foodgrains is done in covered wagons but whenever these stocks are moved in open wagons, they are given tarpaulin covering properly fastened and lashed. Open wagons are loaded in fair weather only in block rakes with escort to ensure proper protection at various intermediate points in transit. At the destination also, inspection of stocks is carried out by trained technical personnel.
