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Singh was the Chief Minister. May I know what is the attitude of the present Chief Minister, Pt. Kamlapati Tripathi in regard to this proposal?

SHRI F. H. MOHSIN: He is quite correct that this attitude was when Ch. Charan Singh was the Chief Minister. I have already stated the view of the present U. P. Government in the main answer which says:—

"Subsequently, the Government of Uttar Pradesh have also revised their earlier views and intimated that they had not objection to the allocation of women members of the Indian Administrative. Service to the Uttar Pradesh cadre."

This we received on 17-5-72.

## DISTORTIONS IN THE GROWTH OF ECONOMY

\*220. SHRI BHUPESH GUPTA :f SHRI SANAT KUMAR RAHA :

Will the Minister of PLANNING be pleased to state :

- (a) whether the mid term appraisal of the current Plan had pointed out to serious distortions in the growth of the economy; and
- (b) if so, what corrective measures have been taken to remove these distortions f

THE MINISTER OF STATE IN THE MINISTRY OF PLANNING (SHRI MOHAN DHARIA): (a) Yes, Sir. Attention of the Hon'ble Members is invited to the Fourth Plan Mid-term Appraisal Document placed before the Parliament on 22nd December, 1971.

- (b) Action has been initiated on some of the corrective measures indicated in the Document itself such as:
  - (i) high priority being given to optimum utilisation of capacity.
  - (ii) undertaking detailed exercises for identifying the measures necessary to increase output in public and private sector industries.
  - (iii) greater emphasis on exporf promotion.
  - (iv) import substitution to proceed with greater urgency.

fThe question was actually asked on the floor of the House by Shri Bhuprsh Gupta.

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(v) issue of detailed guidelines to State Governments and Central Ministries to ensure greater financial discipline.

SHRI BHUPESH GUPTA: My question related to the growth of economy, the frst part of the question. Has it occurred to the Government that this bottleneck, distortion and shortfall in the targeted growth of economy is mainly due to the fact that there are no structural changes in the economy without which there cannot be stable growth or desired level of growth? May I know in that view whether the Government will consider the advisability of ensuring the industrial growth by State monopolising in the sector of trade and also taking over the industries of monopoly houses and giving land to the tiller and so on? Has it occurred to the Government that that kind of structural changes would ensure the requisite rate of growth as well as stability?

SHRI D. P. DHAR: We will take all these suggestions into account.

SHRI BHUPESH GUPTA: The suggestions have been taken. I am very glad. But I would like to know this. Going through the Appraisal we find there is no realisation yet that unless radical, structural changes are made in the economy, in the agrarian sector, by giving land to the tiller, even in the industrial sector by State taking over or nationalising the 75 monopoly houses and in the trade sector by nationalising certain external and internal trades, il is not possible today to ensure a balanced growth, a balanced economic development and growth.

SHRI D. P. DHAR: The question is whether the Mid-Term Appraisal of the Current Plan has pointed out serious distortions in the growth of <a href="mailto:economy.lt">economy.lt</a> is a I representative document and this was discussed in ihis House for nearly four days. And for any question that arises out of that. 1 am at the disposal of

the honourable Member to reply. But these suggestions which are very valuable indeed contained in his statement, if 1 may put it that way with due respect, shall be taken into account in making « further appraisal of the Fourth Five Year Plan.

SHRI SANAT KUMAR RAHA: The objectives of the planning are to remove poverty. In this connection I want to know from the Minister how far the Directive Principles of the Constitution have been aimed at in bringing about structural changes in our economy immediately without which planning would still remain a misnomer.

SHRI MOHAN DHAR IA: The Directive Principles of are very much borne formulating the policies ment . . .

SHRI BHUPESH GUPTA: Borne in mind?

SHRI MOHAN DHARIA: And even while formulating the Plan we shall see that the Directive Principles are also taken into account.
