LEPROSY CASES IN RANCHI

1039. SHRI B. R. MUNDA: Will Ihe Minister of WORKS AND HOUSING AND HEALTH AND FAMILY PLANNING be pleased to state:

(a) whether it is a fact that a large number of persons suffering from leprosy are residing at Ranchi town and its suburbs;

- (b) whether the disease is infectious;
- (c) whether it is also a fact that the disease is likely to infect the inhabitants of the town and the Central Government Employees of National Coal Development Corporation, Hindustan Steel, Heavy Engi neering Corporation, A. G. Office and several Government offices functioning at Ranchi; and

(d) if the answer to part (a) above is in affirmative what is the plan of Government to prevent and control the disease?

THE MINISTER OF STATE IN THE MINISTRY OF WORKS AND HOUSING AND HEALTH AND FAMILY PLANNING (PROF. DEBIPRASAD CHATTOPADHYAYA): (a) There are some leprosy patients in Ranchi town and its suburbs, usually beggars.

- (b) Leprosy is an infectious disease but all cases of leprosy are not infectious. In our country about 20 to 25% of the leprosy cases are of infectious type. In fection from these tnfectious cases can be transmitted only by intinvite contact of skin to skin contact.
- (c) It is unlikely for any one to get the infection from those wandering leprosy beggars unless one continuously mixes among them.
- (d) The existing Brambe hospital and its outdoor clinic is considered sufficient to cater to the treatment of leprosy patients. It is the policy of the Government that leprosy patients should take treatment from outdoor clinics staying in their own homes. The Government of Bihar are understood to be surveying the area and if considered necessary as a result of the survey, the question of opening of Leprosy Control Unit or Survey. Education and Treatment Centre under the Fourth Five Year Plan will be considered.
