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1971 migrants as had returned from Bangla Desh might be admitted to the Mana Group of Transit Centres ,near Raipur provided they had been living in camps or rehabilitation sites and had deserted those sites in the wake of the liberation of Bangla Desh. Steps are accordingly being taken to move all such families to Mana where necessary relief assistance will be given.]

Measures to Increase Employment Potential.

*644. MISS SAROJ PURUSHOTTAM KHAPARDE: Will the Minister of LABOUR AND REHABILITATION be pleased to state:

- (a) whether it is a fact that the experts of International Labour Organisation during the session held in Delhi had suggested measures to increase employment potential in the country; and
- (b) if so, the reaction of Government thereto?

THE MINISTER OF LABOUR AND REHABILITATION (SHRI R. K. KHADIL-KAR): (a) and (b) Presumably, the reference is to the Joint Workshop on Employment Generation which the Expert Committee on Unemployment held in collaboration with the International Labour Organisation at New Delhi from 2nd to 7th August, 1972 to thrash out various facets of some of the important issues before it. International as well as national experts contributed papers on various topics and participated in discussions. The conclusions of the workshop will be duly taken into account by the Committee while formulating their final recommendations.
