STATEMENT BY MINISTER

Report of Comptroller and Auditor-General relating to sale of Centaur Hotels

THE MINISTER OF FINANCE (SHRI P. CHIDAMBARAM): Sir, after examining the Report of the Comptroller and Auditor-General in respect of sale of two Hotels, belonging to the Hotel Corporation of India, the Government has decided to order an inquiry.
