RELEASE OF STOCKS OF PULSES BY
FOOD CORPORATION OF INDIA

625. SHRI KALYAN ROY: Will the Minister of AGRICULTURE be pleased to state :

(a) whether the Government of West Bengal has criticised the Food Corporation of India for its failure to release stocks of pulses and maize; and if so, the details thereof; and

(b) what quantity of pulses and maize have since been released by the Food Corporation of India at the request of West Bengal Government ?

THE MINISTER OF STATE IN THE MINISTRY OF AGRICULTURE (SHRI ANNASAHAB SHINDE) : (a) No, Sir. The West Bengal Government only approached the Food Corporation of India for supply of maize and for building up stocks of pulses in case the prices went up.

(b) I The corporation has agreed to deliver 1498 tonnes of maize, as desired by the State Government. The proposal for stocking of pulses in West Bengal by the Food Corporation did not materialise.
