## REFUGEES FROM BANGLA DESH

754. SHRI SASANKASEKHAR SANYAL: Will the Minister of LABOUR AND REHABILITATION be pleased to state:

- (a) whether there have been cases of fresh influx of refugees into India after Bangla Desh has become a free and Independent Sovereign State:
  - (b) if so, the reasons for such influx;
- (c) the steps taken by Government for taking up the matter with Bangladesh Government on this behalf: and
- (d) how they are being accommodated in India?

THE MINISTER OF LABOUR AND (SHRI REHABILITATION R KHADILKAR): (a) and (b) No, Sir. There has been no fresh influx of refugees as such, but some persons have come over to India from Bangla-desh since the liberation of that country. Some have come with permits and wished to visit friends and relations; some came because of conditions of distress encountered in their localities, whilst the majority came because they had migrated to India previously and had returned to Bangladesh unauthorizedly alongwith the post March 1971 refugees.

to Questions

- (c) The matter has been taken up with the Government of Bangladesh. The casual entry of persons will be automatically controlled with the introduction of the system of passports and visas for travel between the two countries. A suitable arrangement for the return of pre-March 1971 migrants, who had gone over to Bangladesh unauthori/.edly, is also expected to be evolved jointly by the two Governments.
- (d) Persons falling in the last-named category are being accommodated in the Central Camp at Mana, near Raipur.

Sheikh Mujibur Rehman. Government were approached for assistance in providing an aircraft to take Sheikh Mujibur Rehman from Dacca to London. The aircraft was readily provided by us.

THE MINISTER OF LABOUR AND REHABILITATION (SHRI R. K. KHADILKAR): The All India Consumer Price Index Numbers for agricultural labourers (Base 1960-61 = 100) moved as follows:—

1969 — 186 1970 — 194 1971 — "93 June, — 203 (Provisional). 1972

The wages of farm labour falling in the Central sphere were last fixed/revised at Rs. 2.50 to Rs. 3.70 per day according to areas, in May, 1969. Taking note of the subsequent rise in the cost of living, it is proposed to revise these rates and a notification in this regard is expected to be published shortly.
