CLOSURE OF THE PATMOHANA COLLIERY *288. SHRI N. K. KRISHNAN: SHRI KALYAN ROY:

- (a) whether it is a fact that the Assistant Labour Commissioner (Central), Asansol, has written a letter on 25-5-72 to the Additional District Magistrate, Asansol about the non-payment of wages to the workers of the Patmohana Colliery and arbitrary closure of the mine; and if so, the details thereof;
- (b) what are the legal dues which have been rendered unemployed by this the Patmohana Colliery;
- (c) what steps have been taken by the Industrial Relations Machinery against the management for arbitrary closure and the non-payment of wages and the details thereof; and
- (d) the total number of workers who have been rendered unemployed by this closure?

THE MINISTER OF LABOUR AND REHABILITATION (SHRI R. KHADILKAR): (a) The Assistant Labour Commissioner (Central), Asansol, wrote a letter to the Additional District Magistrate, Asansol on the 25th May, 1972 informing him about the non-payment of wages to the workers of the Colliery by the management and the closure of 7/8 Pits of the Colliery and requested him to prevail upon the management to make the payments to the workers.

- (b) The wages to weekly paid workers have not been paid from week ending 13th May, 1972 onwards and monthly-paid workers have not been paid wages from the month of April, 1972, onwards. The nature of other dues could not be ascertained for want of records.
- (c) No. 1 and 2 Pits of the Colliery are reported to have started working from 7-8-72. Inclines 7 and 8 are not yet working as restriction has been imposed by the Director General, Mines Safety under Section 22 of the Mines Act, for the relaxation of which the management and the union are reported to have approached the Director General, Mines Safety. An agreement has been entered into by the parties
