## FERTILIZER DISTRIBUTION POLICY OF MADRAS FERTILIZER PLANT

\*314. DR. K. MATHEW KURIAN: Will the Minister of PETROLEUM AND CHEMICALS be pleased *to* state:

(a) whether it is a fact that the joint sector Madras Fertilizers is distributing large part of its products through 'foreign-associated at large business house' distributors instead of marketing cent percent products through public sector and cooper-tive channels; (b) whether it is also a fact that Government directed the private sector Indian Explosives Ltd. to market its fertilizer products through its own distributors instead of using established trade channels; and

(c) if so, what steps Government are taking to secure commanding heights for public sector in fertilizer marketing?

THE MINISTER OF LAW AND JUS-TICE AND PETROLEUM AND CHEMI-CALS (SHRI H. R. GOKHALE) : (a) The share of cooperatives and public sector distribution agencies in the distribution of products of Madras Fertilizers Ltd. during 1972-73 is expected to be about 34 % while the share of private sector institutions will be about 66%.

(b) No, Sir.

(c) The cooperative and the public distribution systems are being used to the extent possible by the producers who have a measure of freedom in the marketing of their products. The National Commission on Agriculture in their interim Report on "Fertilizer Distribution\*' have made certain recommendations and these are currently under the consideration of Govern ment.
