THE DEPUTY MINISTER IN THE MINISTRY OF RAILWAYS (SHRI MOHD. SHAFI QURESHI): (a) Yes, Sir

(b) Productivity of staff has increased due to the introduction of the Incentive Schemes. Fresh recruitment was curtailed and existing surplus staff were absorbed against vacancies caused by normal wastage.

**FERTILIZER DISTRIBUTION POLICY OF MADRAS FERTILIZER PLANT**

\*314. DR. K. MATHEW KURIAN: Will the Minister of PETROLEUM AND CHEMICALS be pleased to state:

(a) whether it is a fact that the joint sector Madras Fertilizers is distributing large part of its products through 'foreign-associated at large business house' distributors instead of marketing cent percent products through public sector and cooperative channels;

(b) whether it is also a fact that Government directed the private sector Indian Explosives Ltd. to market its fertilizer products through its own distributors instead of using established trade channels; and

(c) if so, what steps Government are taking to secure commanding heights for public sector in fertilizer marketing?

THE MINISTER OF LAW AND JUSTICE AND PETROLEUM AND CHEMICALS (SHRI H. R. GOKHALE): (a) The share of cooperatives and public sector distribution agencies in the distribution of products of Madras Fertilizers Ltd. during 1972-73 is expected to be about 34 % while the share of private sector institutions will be about 66%.

(b) No, Sir.

(c) The cooperative and the public distribution systems are being used to the extent possible by the producers who have a measure of freedom in the marketing of their products. The National Commission on Agriculture in their interim Report on "Fertilizer Distribution\*" have made certain recommendations and these are currently under the consideration of Government.
