selected backward districts/areas. The concession provided by these institutions generally include:

- (i) Lower interest vale of 7%. The IDBI lias lowered its rate of inteiest for refinance from 4J% to 3\$% if Slate Finai c.al Corporations/Banks advance loans in backward areas at the rate of 70/.
- (ii) Extension of die period for repayment of the first instalment of the principal amount of the loan from the present 3 years to 5 years;
- (iii) Longer period for repayment of the loans i.e. 15 to 20 years, as againsi 10 to 12 years normally stipulated;
- (iv) 50% reduction in normal service charges;
- (v) in the case of the TFCI and IOICI, the margin of security reduced to 30-35 percent from 50%.

The Government of India have also announced two central subsidy schemes viz. 10% Subsidy Scheme and Transport Subsidy Scheme for the industries in the selected backward areas. Besides, the respective State Government /Union Territory Administrations are also granting various packages of concessions/incentives to attract investment in the backward areas.
