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ing imports and exports in the best interests of the country's economy?

THE DEPUTY MINISTER IN THE MINISTRY OF FOREIGN TRADE (SHRI A. C. GEORGE): A statement is laid on the Table of the House.

STATEMENT

Yes, Sir. The State Trading Corporation has been able to arrange import of adequate quantities of various raw materials in bulk in a planned and phased manner, at competetive prices, thereby effecting savings in foreign exchange and ensuring their supply to the consumers at reasonable prices. As regards exports, the STC has been able to eliminate internal competition amongst exporters, to secure the best prices from foreign buyers and to promote exports of various commodities, and has been at the same time, assisting small manufacturers in exporting their products.

CONTINUANCE OF EXISTING TRADE ARRANGEMENTS WITH U.K.

- *20. SHRI K. L. N. PRASAD: Will the Minister of FOREIGN TRADE be pleased to state:
- (a) whether Government have approached the U. K. Government for the continuance of the existing trade arrangement upto 1975;
- (b) if so, the reaction of U.K. Government thereto and whether any talks have been taken place or are likely to take place with that Government this regard; and
- (c) if such talks have already taken place, the outcome thereof?

THE DEPUTY MINISTER IN THE MINISTRY OF FOREIGN TRADE (SHRI A. C. GEORGE): (a) to (c) Yes, Sir. In February 1972 the Government of India suggested to the U. K. Government the continuance of existing Indo-U.K. trade arrangements upto 31st January, 1975. The U.K. Government have sent a reply recently proposing an order of priority and a broad time-table for holding discussions on these problems.

The reply is under examination and the question of holding further talks with the U. K. Government will be decided in due course.

 - (b) if so, the reasons therefor; and
- (c) what steps have been taken by Government in this regard ?

THE DEPUTY MINISTER IN THE MINISTRY OF RAILWAYS (SHRI MOHD. SHAFI QURESHI): (a) No, Sir. (b) and (c) Do not arise.

In fact Railways moved substantially more coal to the Power Houses from all the fieldsin 1971-72 as compared to the previous year as is indicated in the Statement laid on the Table of the Sabha.

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Recent power crisis in the various region was caused by reasons other than the shor tage of rail transport like low levels of wate in the hydrogeneration reservoirs, breal down of Atomic Power Station at Tarapore inability of some power houses to drav adequate coal and lignite from the norma planned sources by means other than rai etc.

During the period of this crisis railways have made arrangements to give increased supplies not only to those power houses which take coal normally by rail but also to those which never planned to take their coal supplies by rail and did not therefore have adequate rail facilities for any large scale supplies by rai 1. In doi ng so Rai lway s had to undertake a lot of irrational, operationally inconvenient, uneconomical ant unplanned movements at the cost of movement to the other consumers.

INDIAN AID FOR KARNALI HYDRO-ELEC-TRIC PROJECT IN NEPAL

THE MINISTER OF IRRIGATION AND POWER (DR. K. L. RAO): (a) to (c) So far, His Majesty's Government of Nepal have approached India only for an assurance that India would be willing to purchase a large block of power from their Karnali Hydro-electric Project. India has agreed in principle.
