## REDUCTION IN NUMBER OF INDIAN TIGERS, LEOPARDS AND GIR LIONS

- 330. SHRI M. K. MOHTA: Will the Minister of AGRICULTURE be pleased to state:
- (a) the extent to which the number of Indian tigers, leopards and Gir lions has been reduced during the last three years:
- (b) whether a special committee is proposed to be set up to study ways and means to conserve the species;
- (c) whether poaching and smuggling of skin of rare animals is being done by poachers on large scale and that skins of rare species although banned continue to flood the Calcutta market from the neighbouring States of Assam, Bihar, Madhya Pradesh and Orissa; and
- (d) if so, the steps taken by Government in the matter?

THE MINISTER OF STATE IN THE MINISTRY OF AGRICULTURE (PROF. SHER SINGH): (a) Since systematic census of tigers, leopards and lions has not been conducted annually in the last three years, the extent to which the number of these animals has been reduced is not known. The number of Gir lions was 177 in the year 1968 when the last census was conducted. A countrywide census of tigers is arranged to be conducted to during this summer and the number of tigers is likely to be known in the next few months.

- (b) A task force consisting of 11 members including leading Naturalists and Conservationists, with the Chairman, IBWL, as the head of the Task Force has been constituted recently to draw a detailed project for the conservation of the tigers in the country within a period of three months. A committee has also been set up to find a suitable alternative home for the Indian Lion.
- (c) Large scale poaching is not reported by the States. It is likely that smuggled skins get into Calcutta market from neighbouring States because there is no ban or restriction on the movement and internal trade of the skins in many States. There is a ban only on the export of skins of rare animals.
- (d) A comprehensive Central Legislation to regulate the movement and trade of wild life products is under consideration to check shooting and smuggling.
