THE DEPUTY MINISTER IN THE MINISTRY OF INDUSTRIAL DEVF-LOPMENT (PROF. SIDDHESHWAR PRASAD): (a) and (b) A Centrally Sponsored Programme consisting of five schemes, including a scheme for Commercial Estates, has been drawn up. A sum of Rs. 6.5 crores was provided for these schemes. This amount was allocated to the State Governments in December, 1971 indicating the amount for each scheme. The State Governments were, however, free, to utilise the funds for one or more of the schemes. The implementation of the schemes was left entirely to the State Governments.

POST OFFICE FOR GRAM PANCHAYATS

- 635. SHRI SANAT KUMAR RAHA: Will the Minister of COMMUNICA-TIONS be pleased to state:
- (a) whether Government have any plan to open one post office for every gram panchayat; and
- (b) if so, when this plan is likely to materialise?

THE MINISTER OF COMMUNI-CATIONS (SHRI H. N. BAHUGUNA): (a) At the beginning of the IV Five year Plan, the question of accelerating opening of post offices at Gram Panchayat villages It was decided by the was considered. Government that during the Fourth Plan period, Post Offices would be opened at Gram Panchayat villages provided the following conditions were satisfied:

(i) Distance from the nearest existing post office should not be less than 2 miles

- (ii) (a) The loss should not exceed Rs. 750 per annum per post if the population to be office, served within a radius of 2 miles is 2000 or more. (ii) (b) The loss should not exceed Rs. 500 per annum per post office where the population to be served within a radius of 2 miles is less than 2000.
- (b) With this accent on opening of Post Offices at Gram Panchayat Villages it is expected that in the course of years more and more Gram Panchayat villages will be provided with Post Offices. however, difficult to fix any time limit in this regard as the opening of post offices in all such villages will depend upon the proposals fulfilling the standards mentioned at (a) above.
