
•580. DR. K. MATHEW KURIAN: Will the Minister of COMMUNICATIONS be pleased to state:

- (c) 7 in 1969, 16 in 1970, 9 in 1971 and 7 in 1972 so far.
- (d) The information is being placed on the Table of the Rajya Sabha.
- (e) The question of ignoring U. P. Circle optees does not arise. Actual repatriation depends on the requirements of Mechanics by the Circles and the ability of T&D Circle to release the Mechanics.

THE MINISTER OF STATE IN THE MINISTRY OF INFORMATION AND BROADCASTING (SHRIMATI NANDINI SATPATHY): (a) A statement giving the requisite information is laid on the Table of the House.

- (c) There is a regular cadre of Programme Executives in A. I. R. to which recruitment is made in accordance with the prescribed rules.

ASSAM NAGALAND BORDER DISPUTE

*582. SHRI GOLAP BARBORA : SHRI PRANAB KUMAR MUKHERJEE

Will the Minister of HOME AFFAIRS be pleased to state:

(a) whether it is a fact that the Assam-Nagaland border dispute is gradually taking

- a serious turn resulting in frequent violent clashes between the armed police forces of both the States causing death and grievous injury to several armed policemen of Assam;
- (b) if so, whether Government of India have asked the Chief Ministers of both Assam and Nagaland to find out a negotiated settlement of the border disputes; and
- (c) what are the findings of the one man commission set up to enquire into the said disputes?

THE MINISTER OF STATE IN THE MINISTRY OF HOME AFFAIRS (SHRI K. C. PANT): (a) and (b) There were some incidents of clashes between the armed police forces of Assam and Nagaland between the 7th and the 15th March, 1972 in the Geleki reserved forest area. The two State Governments were strongly advised to avoid any armed confrontation. The Adviser on Assam-Nagaland Boundary Dispute also visited the States and brought about interim agreements between the two States to withdraw their armed police from this area without prejudice to their respective claims.

(c) The Adviser on Assam-Nagaland boundary has not yet submitted his report.

INVESTMENT IN CENTRAL GOVERNMENT PROJECTS IN RAJASTHAN

- *583. SHRI M. K. MOHTA: Will the Minister of PLANNING be pleased to state:
- (a) the total investment made by the Central Government in the public sector enterprises in Rajasthan upto 3lst March 1971; and
- (b) what scheme has been formulated by the Central Government to bring the per capita investment percentage in the state upto the national average investment?

THE MINISTER OF STATE IN THE MINISTRY OF PLANNING (SHRI MOHAN DHARIA): (a) An investment of Rs. 41 crores has been made by the Central Government in the public sector enterprises in Rajasthan up to 3lst March, 1971. In addition an amount of Rs. 86 crores has also been invested on the Atomic Power Station.

(b) A number of measures are being taken during the Fourth Plan period to step up the investment in the State. In the allocation of Central assistance, 10 per cent of
