OBITUARY REFERENCE

MR. CHAIRMAN. Hon. Members, I refer with profound sorrow to the passing away of Swami Ranganathananda, President of the Ramakrishna Math and Mission on the 25th April, 2005 following a cardiac arrest.

Born in the village of Trikkur in Kerala in December, 1908, Swamiji joined the Ramakrishna Order at its centre in Mysore in 1926 at the age of 18 years.

He became the President of the Ramakrishna Math and the Ramakrishna Mission in September, 1998.

Swami Ranganathananda undertook extensive lecture tours covering fifty countries. He was India's foremost Cultural Ambassador. Through his writings and lectures, the West imbibed the spirit of ancient Indian seers.

He was one of the foremost modern exponents of the Vedanta.

In the death of Swami Ranganathananda, the country has lost an icon of sublime spirituality.
