

in July, 1971, deterioration in the condition of some of the Coke Oven Batteries in Rourkela Steel Plant, break-down in some of the Coke Oven Batteries in Bhilai Steel Plant, maintenance problem in Durgapur Steel Plant and the continued disturbed industrial relations in the Durgapur Steel Plant and the Alloy Steels Plant. Certain factors like the full impact of the Wage Agreement, provision for War Risk Insurance and additional *ad-hoc* bonus, general price escalations etc. have also affected the financial position substantially.

r) Within the limitations imposed by the industrial relations situation, particularly at Durgapur Steel Plant, the Management of Hindustan Steel Limited are making all possible efforts to raise production as rapidly as possible. These include : specialised repairs of the Ovens, use of alternative fuels to supplement gas availability, oil firing in certain furnaces to augment fuel resources, improved maintenance aimed at better equipment availability, speeding up of capital programmes required to correct existing imbalances in production facilities, planned procurement of spares, refractories and other essential material etc. Hindustan Steel Ltd. are making every endeavour to ensure that industrial disputes are settled by negotiation and that the cooperation and participation of workers in the production effort are not hampered. The Government also keep constant watch on the performance of the units and the Company through periodical Task Force Meetings and reviews and render all the assistance that is required.

**ALLOTMENT OF STEEL FOR SMALL SCALE UNITS IN
WEST BENGAL**

Although some marginal adjustments in supplies is possible, any substantial '*ad hoc*' allocation can only be at the cost of some other State or Industrial Sector.
