ALUMINIUM PLANT AT KOREA

361. SHRI J. S. TILAK:

SHRI M.V. BHADRAM :

Will the Minister of STEEL AND MINES be pleased to state :

(a) whether it is a fact that Government have decided to start an aluminium plant at Korba in collaboration with the Soviet Union ;

(b) what will be the annual capacity of this plant and when will it be put into commission ;

(c) have any other aluminium plants in collaboration with other countries, been considered by Government ; and

(d) if so, which are these countries, where will these plants be located and what will be their expected annual capacity ?

THE MINISTER OF STATE IN THE MINISTRY OF STEEL AND MINES (SHRI SHAH NAWAZ KHAN) : (a) Yes, Sir.

(b) The annual capacity of the smelter will be 100,000 tonnes of aluminium metal. The Project is expected to be commissioned in phases between September, 1974 and March, 1979.

(c) Yes, Sir.

(d) An aluminium plant at Ralnagiri (Maharashtra) is proposed to be set up in technical collaboration with M/s. Ghemo-komplex of Hungary. This plant will have a capacity of 50,000 tonnes of aluminium metal per annum.

CHINA INCITING PAKISTAN

362. SHRI K. L. N. PRASAD : Will the Minister of EXTERNAL AFFAIRS be pleased to state :

(a) whether it is a fact that China is inciting Pakistan against India ;

(b) whether it is also a fact that on February 3rd, 1972 the Radio Moscow accused China of stirring up Pakistan against India ; and

(c) if the answers to parts (a) and (b) be in the affirmative, whether any protest has been lodged to China not to incite Pakistan against India ?

THE DEPUTY MINISTER IN THE MINISTRY OF EXTERNAL AFFAIRS (SHRI SURENDRA PAL SINGH) : (a) China has given political support to Pakistan in the latter's anti-Indian postures and supplied weapons to her.

(b) The Government has noticed that the Soviet journal. PARTY LIFE (PARTIINAYA ZHIZN) in its No. III issue for 1972, as released by the Novosty Press Agency on February 15, has stated that China "for a long time exploited the internal crisis in Pakistan, caused by the reactionary anti-popular policy of the military junta, to incite Pakistan to war against India".

(c) The Government of India is taking all necessary measures to defend the national interests of India and her territorial integrity and sovereignty. No protest has been lodged as this would not serve any useful purpose.
