(b) The Polish and Indian delegations, held discussions at the conclusion of which a Protocol was signed regarding the possibilities of cooperation in the coal mining industry, ship-budding industry, engineering industry, chemical industry and trade. Both sides agreed to establish an Indo Polish Commission for Economic, Trade, Scientific and Technical Cooperation.
