AFFAIRS AN TAIGHT I SHRI SURENDRA PAL SINGH): (a) Government of India has conveyed to the British GDvernment, through nornvtl diplomatic channels, its views on the Imnig'ation Bill and the c'isabilities it would impose on Indian immigrants in the UK. It wat urged on the British Government to remove some of the objectionable features of the Bill.

(b) Wiiile the British Government has given »om? clarifications and assurances, these do not remove all our misgivings. How-sver, some effort seems to have been mid: to mitigate partially some of the objee'iouab'.e features of the Bill. It is our hop: that the U K. Government will furthe- modify the p oposed legislation to lessei the hardship of immigrants in the U. K.

Publicity will be given only after the reaction of the State Governments is made available to Government.

(a) Yes, Sir. Government are aware that letters were exchanged on July 16th between the Chinese Ambassador in Kuhmandu and the Finance Secretary, His Majesty's Government of Nepal, by which the Chinese Government are to conduct a survey in the

Butwal area of the Nepal Terai in order to ascertain whether cotton cultivation is possible.

(b) and (c) Government have Examined the implication of this development. Necessary steps are being taken to safeguard our interests.

CONSTRUCTION WORK OF INTER-STATE Bus TERMINUS AT DELHI

- (a) whether the construction worl of the Inter-State Bus Terminus. Kashmeri Gate Delhi has been left unfinished by the contractor and the Delhi Development Authority has been put to heavy losses as a result thereof;

- (c) the steps proposed to be taken by Government for the completion of the unfinished work?

- (a) Yes, Sir. At this stage, it is not possible to determine the extent of loss, if any.
- (b) The contract was for Rs. 94,70,527.00. The contract has been rescinded as the work was not progressing satisfactorily aid the contractor was not willing to work according to the conditions specified in the tender. The contractor had put in certain claims whirb could not be accepted.
- (c) The Delhi Development Authority have invited tenders for the completion of the unfinished work.
