letters in June, 1971 to the Chief Ministers of
Maharashtra Andhra Pradesh, Assam,
Haryana, Madhya Pradesh, Rajasthan, Uttar
Pradesh, Hima-chal Pradesh, and the leaders
of Congress Party in the Legislatures of
Kerala and Bihar stressing the need for
avoiding pomp and show at weddings. The
Prime Minister has also been stressing from
time to time

the need for avoiding wasteful expenditur of
all kinds,
