PANT) : (a) and (b) The number of foreign tourists commonly known as "Hippies" was 1505 in 1970, and 1258 so far in 1971. These figures do not include information relating to the States of Rajasthan and Jammu and Kashmir.

(c) and (d) 77 are reported to have been arrested for offences under the excise, opium and prohibition laws, the Indian Penal Code, the Criminal Procedure Code as well as the Foreigners Act.

(e) Instructions have been issued to all State Governments and Union Territory Administrations to keep a strict watch on their activities, to take action against any infringement of the law and to ask them to leave the country when any undesirable activity on their part comes to notice.

Several developmental projects in the three sectors involved in the iron ore export In the mining sector the various I ways and Ports have been undertaken 'with a view to achieve the target of export. In the mining sector to various steps taken include commissioning of new and large mechanised mines at Bai-ladila and Donimalai apart from expansion of. production in the privately owned mines in the different areas. In the Railway Sector the Cuttack Paradip rail link is already under construction. The Railways are also taking steps to increase the capacity, including rolling stock of other existing railway links leading from the mining areas to the norts. In regard to iron ore handling facilities at the ports, deep draft alongside berth already loading has been commissioned in Paradip, the capacity of which is being augmented. Work is also in progress to commission berths for handling ore at Haldia, Marmagoa, Madras Outer Harbour Visakhapat-nam Outer and Harbour.
