PANT) : (a) and (b) Special development schemes which will cost Rs. 45 crores by the end of the Fourth Five Year Plan have already been taken up for the accelerated development of Telengana. These schemes are formulated on the recommendations of the Regional Committee and a close watch is kept on their implementation by the Telengana Development Committee and Plan Implementation Committee, and also through periodical review meetings held by the Prime Minister. There is no proposal to set up an autonomous body for this purpose.
