(a) whether Government have taken any steps to set up plants in the Public Sector to produce fast selling consumer goods like synthetic fibre, woollen goods, domestic utensils, electrical gadgets, refrigerators and lamps; and

(b) if not, the reasons therefor?

(SHRI GHANSHYAM OZA): (a) Government have decided in principle that the role of public sector should be expanded and extended to new fields, including those consumer industries in which major production gaps are likely to develop in coming years. With this end in view, some proposals for the manufacture of consumer goods in the public sector are under consideration and feasibility reports for some of these items have been prepared. These reports are under various stages of consideration. A final selection of the consumer industries to be taken up in public sector has not been completed so far

SHRI GHANSHYAM OZA: As I said, certain items have been taken up and feasibility reports are being prepared, and as soon as they are ready, we will try to go into them.

SHRI KRISHAN KANT: May I know from the honourable Minister how long the Ministry will take to decide upon the items? Have they given and priority? Why is there so much delay? Is it because of some pressure from the monopolisms that they do not want to go into it? Is that the reason why there is delay?

SHRI GHANSHYAM OZA: There is no question of being pressurised from any quarters. We do not deviate from our policy. We go according to a well-laid down policy. As a matter of fact, we have already entered into the field of a consumer goods. The honourable Member will remember that we are producing, for example, bread, modern bread, at so many centres, we are producing salt, we are producing drugs, we are producing watches. We have already entered into consumer goods.

SHRI KRISHAN KANT: Before the Question Hour is over you must reply by what time the report will be ready.

SHRI GHANSHYAM OZA: These reports are being studied, feasibility reports are being prepared . . .

SHRI KRISHAN KANT: How long will it take?

SHRI GHANSHYAM OZA: I cannot say; as early as possible, and consistent with our resource. That should also be taken note of.
