Retirement age of ITDC Employees

294. SHRI GAYA SINGH:

SHRI V.V. RAGHAVAN:

Will the Minister of TOURISM AND CULTURE be pleased to state:

(a) whether Government are considering a proposal to roll back retirement age from 60 to 58 years for ITDC employees;

(b) whether it is also a fact that Government are considering a Voluntary Retirement Scheme (VRS) for its employees; and

(c) if the answer to part (a) and (b) be in positive, the details thereof and how many employees are expected to exit from the organisation by these two steps during the year?

THE MINISTER OF TOURISM AND CULTURE (SHRI ANANTH KUMAR): (a) and (b) Yes, Sir.

(c) As per information given by ITDC, approximately, 1200 employees comprising of 200 executives and 1000 non-executives are likely to opt for Voluntary Retirement Scheme. As regards number of employees expected to exit due to rolling back retirement age, the information is not readily available and it can be estimated only on fixing up a cut off date for effecting roll back of retirement age. The Company has proposed that Roll back of retirement age should be given priority over introduction of Voluntary Retirement Scheme.
