(a) what is the total business secured by the Life Insurance Corporation during the year 1970-71;

(b) whether Government have taken any decision to drop the proposal for reducing the premium rates; if so, the reasons therefor; and

(c) what is the number and the total value of pending claims awaiting settlement by the Life Insurance Corporation at present?

THE MINISTER OF FINANCE/ फाइनेंस मंत्री (SHRI Y. B. CHAVAN) : (a) The new business secured by the LIC during 1970-71 amounted to more than Rs. 1303 crores.

(b) The LIC reduced premium rates under certain without-profit plans of assurances with effect from 1st February, 1970. These reductions were justified by actuarial considerations, but in view of the uncertainty of the trend of future expenses it decided to defer consideration of any revision of premium rates under 'with-profit plans' till such time as expenses have stabilised, particularly because equity to policyholders under the with-profit plans can be ensured through the mechanism of bonus distribution.

Recently, the LIC revived the premium rates under "one Year Renewable Group Term Assurance Plan" and "level-Premium Group Term Assurance Plan" and has decided to reduce the premium rates under these plans with effect from 1st June, 1971.

(b) whether this would create undue hardships for people in non-Hindi speaking States;

(c) whether the teachers of Central Schools as well as parents in some of the non-Hindi speaking States have already expressed their resentment over this directive; and

(d) if so, the reaction of the Central Government in regard thereto?

No such directive has been issued by the Government. However, in April, 1971, reports appeared in some sections of the Press giving an impression that Union Ministry has issued directive, which would lead to the conversion of the Kendriya Vidyalas into completely Hindi-Medium Schools. Since this was not factually correct, a 'Press Note' was issued immediately contradicting the false report.

*TCft (DR. KARAN SINGH) : (a) and (b) According to latest figures available from the International Union of Official Travel Organisations, India ranked 22nd among the countries of the world and 4th among the Asian countries in foreign exchange earnings during January—September, 1970.

(c) The major steps being taken for the promotion of tourist traffic to India include a, vigorous sales oriented marketing approach overseas, relaxation of visa formalities, improved facilitation procedures and strengthening of the tourism infrastructure within the country.

NATURE OF GOODS SMUGGLED INTO INDIA

and the quantity of goods smuggled into India, their origin and the States into which such goods are mostly smuggled; and

No, Sir, as there are no practical means of reaching any reasonable conclusion? about the quantity of goods smuggled into India. It is difficult to precisely name the countries from where goods smuggled into India originate. However, the articles constituting the bulk of the goods smuggled into the country generally bear the markings of the country of manufacture as under :

Gold.....	U.K., France, Switzerland
Watches.....	Switzerland, Japan.
Synthetic yarn & Fabrics.....	Japan
Other articles.....	France, England, Germany, Japan, & China.

Slates of Gujarat, Maharashtra, Mysore, Kerala and Tamil-Nadu are more vulnerable to such smuggling.
