- (a) the type and extent of help sought by the Cevlon Government from the Government of India in dealing with the insurgent movement there; and
 - (b) the details of the help given?

(sARDAR SWARAN SINGH):
(a) and (b) The Government of Ceylon had requested the Government of India for assistance to meet the threat of insurgency from certain terrorist groups. The Government of India agreed to provide all assistance that was possible within our resources. We provided Helicopters for non-lethal purposes and Indian naval ships for patrolling Ceylon's coast. We also sent some military equipment and some soldiers for ensuring the safety and the proper utilisation of our equipment.

THE MINISTER OF EXTENRAL AFFAIRS/ *Um* H«ff (SARDAR SWARAN SINGH): (a) Yes, Sir.

(b) The US State Department has expressed guarded concern at the use of American arms by Pakistan in East Bengal. An official spokesman of the US State Department has also said that no arms have been provided to the Government of Pakistan since the beginning of this crisis, and the question of deliveries will be kept under review in the light of developments.
