- (b) As this project requires fairly large quantity of expensive drugs, the Association has approached certain Pharmaceutical firms in India for free supply of these drugs. These firms have, however, regretted their inability to do so. The Association continues to tap various sources to obtain free supply of these drugs.
- (c) 'I he Tuberculosis Association of India has applied to the Drugs Controller and the Chief Controller of Imports, Government ol India, for issue of necessary permits for the import of the drugs in question, in case the drugs are offered by firms outside India.

- (a) and (b) We have no statistical data showing the number of unemployed doctors in the country Statewise. There is an overall shortage of doctors in the country particularly in rural areas. At present about 280 Health Centres are without doctors and in many others there is only one doctor as against two required. In District, Sub-Divisional and Taluk/Tehsil hospitals also, there is shortage of doctors particularly of specialists in the District Hospitals. Because of reluctance on the part of doctors to serve in the rural areas, medical graduates may be finding ii difficult to obtain full employment in areas.
- (c) Suitable remedial measures are being taken to encourage doctors to serve in rural hospitals and dispensaries. Increased emoluments by way of special allowance, better facilities of living and working accommodation with adequate drinking

sanitary arrangements and all-weather approach roads to Primary Health Centres or Sub-Centres are contemplated. The Minister for Health, Family Planning, Works, Housing and Urban Development has also issued an appeal to the doctors in the country to render service in the rural areas.
