CENSUS WORK IN INDIA

540. SHRI THILLAI VILLALAN : Will the Minister of HOME AFFAIRS/ ^T *Ht be pleased to state :

- (a) whether the census work in the country has since been completed; and
 - (b) if so, what are the details thereof?

THE DEPUTY MINISTER IN THE MINISTRY OF HOME AFFAIRS/

(SHRI F. H. MOHSIN): (a) and (b) Census operations can be broadly divided into two stages. The first stage of enumeration was completed by 3rd April, 1971. The second stage relates to the processing of the data, its tabulation and preparation of analytical reports. About 106 repional tabulation offices have been set up in different parts of the country. The provisional population totals have already been published. Other results will be published as and when the relevant data are processed. There will be 30 sets of Census volumes one for All India and one for each State and Union Territory. The General Census Reports are expected to be ready by about 1973.
