SHINDE): (a) and (b) The observer of the United Nations Development Programme who attended the Fourth Session of the Asian Coconut Community held in April, 1971 at New Delhi indicated that their organisation would be willing to give favourable consideration, within the limits of their resources, to any specific request that is made to them particularly with regard mutual visits of suitable technical staff of the countries, exchange of germ plasm materials, provision of the services of consultants in certain fields and feasibility studies to determine market-ability of coconut products and the type of plant that would be best suited to the manufacture of products.

OPENING OF NEW MINES BY PRIVATE COLLIERIES

\*288. SHRI M. V. BHADRAM : SHRI BALACHANDRA MENON :

THE MINISTER OF STEEL AND MINES (इस्पात और खान मंत्री (SHRI S. MOHAN KUMARAMANGALAM): (a) and (b) No such proposal is under consideration. However, the policy of Government has been to consider favourably the grant of coal mining leases for contiguous areas to private parties for maintaining production and avoiding hardship likely to be caused due to retrenchment of labour.

THE DEPUTY MINISTER IN THE MINISTRY OF LABOUR AND RE-HABILITATION/श्रम और पुनर्वास मंत्रालय में उपमंत्री (SHRI BALGOVIND VERMA): (a) Yes.

(b) There is no permanent way other than by increasing production and productivity to advance the standard of life of our people and in this view, any attempt directed only towards an increase in wages without any increase in productivity will inevitably result in inflation. Schemes for linking wages with productivity, keeping in view the interest of consumers also, are best worked out at the plant level jointly by the employers and workmen, taking note of local conditions.
