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would be significantly higher than the actual production in 1970-71. The managements of IISCO and TISCO are also taking steps to increase pro-: duction.

(ii) Bokaro Steel Ltd. is expected to reach the 17 million ingot tonnes stage by March 1973 and the 2.5 million tonne stage by March 1974.

(iii) There are a large number of Electric Furnaces in the country producing steel based on scrap. Government have also recently approved additional schemes for the manufacture of steel billets/ingots from scrap in Electric Furnaces by conventional and continuous casting processes.

The cumulative loss incurred by Hindustan Steel Limited as on 31st March 1970 amounted to Rs. 172.83 crores. The accounts for the year 1970-71 have not yet been finalised.

The losses sustained by the Company over the years are due to a number of reasons including such factors as incidence of high capital-related charges, effects of recession, disturbed industrial relations in some of the Plants, rise in cost elements, shortfalls in production etc.

(b) On the basis of the production programme drawn up for the year J971 -72, the Company expects to make up profit during this year.

(c) and (d) The working results of the Company are expected to show improvement with rise in production.
