Comprehensive market surveys are also being made so as to plan a suitable production programme and for diversifying production.

Alternate sources would be the stockyards of other main producers, or the re-rollers. Since all stockyards follow a uniform distribution policy, whether the supply is from Hindustan Steel Limited stockyards or those of other main producers.
