- (a) No, Sir. The Education Commis sion (1964-66) has already studied in a very comprehensive way the position with regard to all levels of education, including University education in the country.

- (c) The University Grants Commission, within the limited resources available with it, is making earnest efforts to improve the quality and content of higher education in accordance with its statutory responsibility. Some of the important programmes under taken by the Commission in this regard are:
 - (i) Development of libraries, laboratories, teaching and research facilities in universities;
 - (ii) Centres of Advanced Study;
 - (iii) Summer Institutes, Seminars, etc.
 - (iv) Modernisation of syllabii;
 - (v) Examination reforms;
 - (vi) Scholarships and fellowships;

- (vii) Travel grants to teachers and scholars:
- (viii) Utilisation of services of retired teachers:
- (ix) Construction of hostels and staff quarters; and
- (x) Students welfare programmes like establishment of Text book Centres in residential areas, establishment of Health, Centres in colleges, establishment and development of college Book Banks, provision of physical amenities, students aid fund, grants to colleges for students clubs/societies formed on functional basis and travel grants to students for specific purposes etc.

The amount withdrawn during December 1970 to February 1971 was Rs. I.50crores. The amount withdrawn during the corresponding period of the previous year was also Rs. 1.50 crores.
