(c) if so, the reaction of Government thereto?

THE MINISTER OF PETROLEUM CHEMICALS/ पटोलियम ग्रौर रसायन मंत्री (SHRI P. C. SETHI): (a) to (c) Apparently the Hon Members are referring to the revised price lists submitted by the drug manufacturers in pursuance of the provisions of the Drugs (Prices Control) Order, 1970. The Drug Price Review Board had scrutinised the price lists of 111) leading drug manfacturers in the organised, medium and small scale sector. Out of 11,732 formulations covered by these price lists, only in respect of 1341 formulations which works out to 11.4 per cent of the total, some price increases were allowed. In the case of 44.9 per cent of the formulations the prices were reduced. By and large the prices of popular formulations have either been reduced or maintained.

Following the British decision, members of the Commonwealth have been in Much with each other on their future coiusc of action but there has been no definiti suggestion so far of any withdrawal from the Commonwealth.

Government of India feel that the full magnitude of the problem and its implications is now being gradually realised in the Capitals of the world. They do not consider it necessary to call a conference of the kind proposed by the Hon'ble Member.

Besides, there are fourteen units for the survey of medicinal plants which are also concerned with gross identification of medicinal plants and herbs.

(b) The identification of fifty-four medicinal plants and herbs in all its aspects has been completed by the Pharmacognosy Units. In addition, the various units for survey of medicinal plants have also completed preliminary identification of about a thousand species of medicinal plants.

PAL SINGH): (a) The strength of the officers and staff of all the Departments of the High Commission of all India, London, was 640 in 1970-

The expenditure for 1970-71 so far booked is Rs. 173.28 lakhs.

- (b) Yes, Sir. The question of economy consistent with functional effectiveness of the High Commission of India, London, is continuously under Government's attention.
- (c) The High Commission was inspected thrice by the Foreign Service Inspectors during the period 1967—1971 with accent on its stafling pattern and economy. In 1968-69, there were 745 posts. During the period from 1969-70 to 1970-71, 99 posts

were reduced. The expenditure in 1968-69 was Rs. 252.14 lakhs, while that accounted so far in the accounts for 1970-71 (still open till August 1971) is Rs. 173.28 lakhs. This will mean a saving of approximately Rs. 75 lakhs.

DOCTORS IN SOUTH AFRICA

*378. SHRI MONORANJAN ROY:

SHRI NIREN GHOSH: Will the Minister of EXTERNAL AFFAIRS/ विदेश मन्त्री be pleased to state:

- (a) whether Government are aware of the difficulties faced by the Indian doctors in South Africa who have not yet been granted permits to continue their present practice in that country;

HIE DEPUTY MINISTER IN THE MINISTRY OF EXTERNAL AFFAIRSY TOTAL AFFAIRSY INCLUDED A PAL SINGH): (a) Government are not aware of any Indian doctors facing such difficulties. However, there have been reports that under the Group Areas Act, some South African doctors of Indian origin have not been allowed to continue practice in their former areas as the Act has excluded them from those areas. The intention appears to be to prevent them from tending to people other than those of Indian origin.

(b) and (c) The Government of India's attitude to the policy of apartheid on which the above is based is well-known. We have unequivocally and consistently condemned it at the United Nations and at other international forums.
