POSTS AND TELEGRAPHS COMMUNICATIONS IN ANDAMANS

- 911 SHRI SITARAM JAIPURIA Will the Minister of COMMUNICATIONS/ सचार मन्त्री be pleased to state
- (a) whether it is a fact that Government have drawn up a scheme involving Rupees 40 lakhs for improving post and telegraph communications in the Andamans, and
 - (b) if so the details thereof?

THE MINISTER OF COMMUNICA-TIONS/सवार मती (SHRI H N BAHU-GUNA) (a) and (b) A scheme including the following proposals for the development and improvement of P&T facilities in the Andaman and Nicobar Islands is currently under examination

- (i) Formation of a separate Postal Division for the administration of the Postal Services on the Islands. This would also enable the Islands to be regarded as a separate unit of recruitment for the clerical grades in the Post Office and would obviate the need to bring staff from the mainland.
- (ii) Utilisation of all available steamer services both passenger and cargo, for conveyance of mails between the mainland and the Islands
- (iii) Utilisation of sailings of all Govern ment vessels between the various Islands on other duties for conveyance of malbetween various post offices
- (iv) Opening of a floating mobile Post Office on an experimental basis by the inter Island steamer serving the Souther 1 group of Islands
- (v) Improvement of the Wireless Telegraph and Radio links between the nairland and the Islands
- (vi) Provision of Wireless Telegraph/ Radio Telephone links for inter-Island communication working by vern Port Blair

and five side stations viz. Mayabunder, Nan Cowrie, Rangat, Diglipur and Campbell Bay.

- (vii) Relaxation of the condition of minimum income for opening of rural Post Offices on the Islands.
- (viii) Employment of part-time staff to enable expeditious sorting of mails received for delivery
- (ix) Delivery of telegrams in Port Blair through Motor Cycle despatch riders
- (x) Acceptance of Telegraphic Money Orders upto Rs. 100 for transmission through Police Wireless network

The developmental proposals are all within the present policy of the Department for extension of P&T facilities in the country with special reference to the less developed areas. There will thus be no additional financial implications specially for the Islands, as a result of these proposals. Some of the proposals eg constituting the Islands as a separate recruitment unit, will mean appreciable savings, as it will obviate the payment of special allowances to the staff brought over from the mainland.

The Postal Division has already been opened and its effect on the postal services will be apparent within the next few months Orders have also been issued for opening the Mobile Post Office in the inter-Islands steamer and for the employment of parttime staff

The provision of Wireless Telegiaph/Radio Telephone links between the mainland and the Islands is expected to be completed by the end of 1972

The provision of the Wireless Telegraph/Radio Telephone links between Port Blair and the five side stations on the other Islands is expected to be completed by the end of this year.

The other proposals are under examination and an early decision will be taken. INDIA'S TRADE GAP IN 1970-71

- (b) India's exports and imports during 1970-71 totalled Rs 1530 65 crores and Rs 1628 17 crores respectively
- (c) It is the declared policy of Government to undertake effective steps to bring about a better balance in our foreign trade. The export 'arge' for the Fourth Five-Year Plan is an average annual rate of growth of 7% To that end. Government have adopted a number of measures to increase production of export products, to strengthen the competitive ability and to facilitate their marketing abroad The Export Policy Resolution laid on the Table of Parliament in July '70 gives a broad indication of policies that Government plan to adopt so as to ensure that our exports grow in line with plan targets
