XV& \*Rf[[ (SHRI SHAH NAWAZ KHAN): (a) and (b) In terms of ingot steel, the production at the three Plants of Hindustan Steel Limited during 1970-71 was to the extent of 61.2% of the installed capacity. The Company incurred a loss of Rs. 10.47 crores in 1969-70. The accounts for the year 1970-71 are being compiled and 'the exact position would be known only after the accounts are closed and audited. The present indications, however. are that the Company would incur a loss during 1970-71 also, which might be more or less of the same order as in the preceding year. The loss is primarily due\* to shortfalls in production in the Durgapur and Rourkela Steel Plants, which, in turn, was due partly to disturbed industrial relations throughout the year in Durgapur and during the first half of the year in Rourkela. There were also certain technical and operational constraints/ deficiencies at these Plants.

(c) and (d) The meeting with the Finance Minister took place on the 30th April, 1971. At this meeting, the performance of the Company was discussed and the various steps to be taken to attain higher production in 1971-72 were considered. A number of measures designed to achieve this end have already been initiated.
