On an average, Nirodh users form 95% of the total convent ional contraceptive users.

- (b) As on 30th April, 1971, about 52 million pieces of Nirodh received as gift from the United States Agency for International Development and Swedish International Development Authority were avai lable in stock at the Government Medical Store Depots. At the present rate of sale of over 5 million pieces Nirodh per month, it is expected that the quantity will be consumed by January, 1972.
- (c) the actual production of the public sector undertaking at Trivandrurr., i.e. Hindustan Latex Ltd., was 40.45 and 77.43 million pieces during 1969-70 and 1970-71 respectively. Against this, orders to the extent of 46.99 and 69.99 m'llion pieces of Nirodh were placed during 1969-70 and 1970-71 respective! \}. Thus, it would be observed that orders for 116.98 million pieces were against the actual production of 117.88 million pieces.

 - (ii) Imports of scda ash by the State Trading Corporation have been and are being arranged;
